## **Year 3 Updates**

What a brilliant half term we have had in Year 3! In English, we have been reading Roald Dahl's 'The Twits' and have used this to inspire our descriptive writing. We learnt about prepositions, apostrophes for possession and consolidated our learning on simple and multi-clauses sentences. Our writing culminated in us writing amazing character descriptions of Mr Twit. The children enjoyed being creative and truly came up with some imaginative ideas.

This half term in maths we have continued to consolidate our learning on the four operations and place value through our daily arithmetic, which we are getting better and better at.

Our phase learning has been focused on length. The children have measured and converted a range of lengths in m, cm and mm. Although at times we have found it difficult to convert from one unit to another, we have demonstrated our Growth Mindset and the children should be proud of themselves for not giving up! We have also continued daily times tables speed tests, the children have been brilliant at persevering through the tests and their times table knowledge is rapidly improving. Keep up the good work and remember to practise daily!

This half term we were very excited about starting our creative rotation on a Thursday afternoon. We have loved learning the Ukulele, trying out the green screen, cooking flatbread and using charcoal and pastels in art. In Geography we have been learning about the seven continents and five oceans of the world and used an atlas to locate and label these on a world map. We have also used an atlas and Digimaps to locate Poole and Dorset. We enjoyed using compasses to navigate around the school grounds and looking at the results of our parent survey to learn about how tourism impacts our local area.

Well done on another super half term Year 3! Enjoy the Easter holidays. The Year 3 team.

## **Year 4 Updates**

We cannot believe that we have almost reached the Easter holidays already! In English, we have used the text 'Ice Trap: Shackleton's Incredible Expedition' to inspire diary writing with a focus on subordinate clauses, adjectives to create emotion and the use of different tenses. In reading, the children enjoyed developing their oracy when learning their poems for the poetry busk. It was great to see the children perform so confidently to an audience.

In maths, the children have been learning about the difference between proper and improper fractions. They have learned how to convert between improper fractions, proper fractions and mixed numbers and more recently, how to subtract fractions from whole amounts. The children are continuing to make great progress with their times tables. We would be grateful if you could encourage your child to log into TTRockstars as often as possible when at home - thank you!

In geography, our mountain topic was welcomed with great enthusiasm. The children enjoyed learning about plate tectonics and how these create mountains. The children were able to discuss why people might visit mountainous areas and how increased tourism can impact these areas. As part of their Applied Learning project, the children used their understanding of climate and environment to create their own mountain survival toolkit.

More recently, Year 4 enjoyed a visit from Reverend Mike and Elaine from St Peter's Church and learned more about Good Friday and the festival of Easter. The children embraced the opportunity to ask questions around this. Another highlight of the half term has been the continuation of samba sessions during music.

## **Year 5 Updates**

It has been a great half term for year 5, with lots of good learning going on, and it has been lovely to see the children continuing to develop as the weeks have progressed.

In English we have been enjoying our class text 'The Nowhere Emporium' and all its various mysteries! It has given us a good context too for our model write, and for our focus areas of relative clauses and figurative language such as similes, metaphors and personification, all leading up to our independent writes where we had the chance to develop our very own rooms for the Emporium in detailed setting descriptions. The children showed some lovely creativity and imagination! They have also enjoyed World Book Day and preparing our poems in each class to perform during our Poetry Day celebration!

Maths saw us starting with the tricky subject of adding and subtracting fractions, including doing this with mixed numbers! So many steps to remember, such as converting between mixed and improper fractions where needed. We have also done some useful work around multiplying fractions and sequences, before moving onto further work with decimals, exploring thousandths and how to record them as decimals and fractions, and then starting to explore units of measure, including converting between them and reading them accurately from scales. This is a really important skill for the children to develop, and just like times tables, any work you can do on supporting your child in learning the key conversions (e.g. how many grams in 2 ½ kilograms, or how many metres is 364 centimetres) will be hugely valuable and much appreciated! All in all, the children's maths really is going from strength to strength, which is great to see.

We have also been thoroughly enjoying our space topic and the variety of activities we have taken part in, from our initial hook, creating a human solar system with giant inflatable planets, to our experiment on the playground exploring the length and direction of shadows (during a rare sunny day!). At the time of writing, we are just finalising the television programmes we are creating about the various planets, and looking forward to our fantastic finale of an exciting planetarium experience in the hall!

As we venture into the latter half of Year 6, the enthusiasm among our students is palpable! With our SATs exams just a few teaching weeks away (May 13th - 16th), it's a crucial time for us. These national exams assess students' proficiency in reading, maths, and grammar, offering them vital knowledge and skills for the future. While individual SATs scores aren't paramount, they can influence projections for GCSE outcomes in some secondary schools. Additionally, we use SATs data to reflect on our teaching methods. Nonetheless, what truly matters is the learning process itself.

Recently, we conducted mock exams, emphasising to students that effort is paramount, regardless of the outcome. Please reiterate this message at home.

While some schools may narrow their curriculum to prioritise SATs performance, at Ocean, we do not! We strive to maintain a broad and balanced curriculum for our pupils. This half term, our focus in science has been evolution and inheritance. PE remains a weekly highlight for many. Spanish, PSHE, computing, and music continue and in English, students are crafting their anthologies, showcasing their creativity through various genres such as setting descriptions, newspaper reports, TV scripts, and even crafting their adventurous sandwich recipes.
