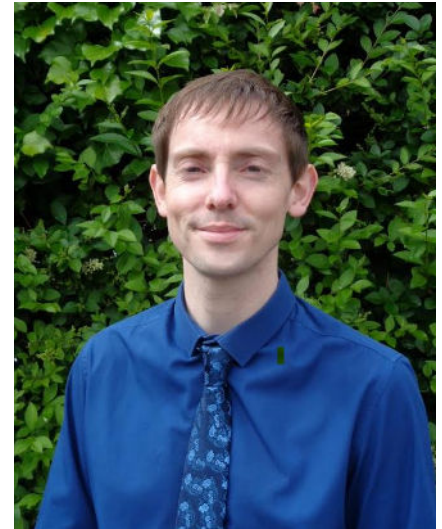

And that person is A. Wolf. His tale starts with a birthday cake for his dear old granny, a bad head cold and a bad reputation. The rest (as they say) is history. A hilariously inventive retelling of the popular Three Little Pigs.'</p> <p>We will be reading this book in our class and will respond by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Quick re-visit of the Year 2 Summer curriculum to determine any gaps. • Looking at a variety of sentence structures and how they impact our writing. • Re-writing our own version of the Three Little Pigs. • Revisiting phonic knowledge. </div> </div>	<h3 style="margin: 0;">Values</h3> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>ASPIRATIONS</p> <p>Our learning skill focus this half term is...</p> <p>TEAM WORK</p> <p>...where we will be looking at what it means to work in a team, and why it is beneficial for us to belong.</p> </div>	<h3 style="margin: 0;">Physical Education</h3> <p>In PE and games this term, we will be working to develop our fundamental movement skills, through small-sided games focusing on throwing and catching.</p> <div style="text-align: right;">  </div> <p>In gymnastics this term, we will be working on developing balance, core strength and coordination.</p>
<h3 style="margin: 0;">Geography</h3> <p><i>Driving Question: How can we, as engineers, defend our coastline from erosion?</i></p> <p><i>This half term, we will be:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Using an atlas to locate *continents and *oceans. • Learning about coastal erosion as part of our physical geography. <p>Click here to see the Learning Journey Map</p>	<h3 style="margin: 0;">Maths</h3> <p>In maths, we will be recapping the Year 2 curriculum and then we will focus upon the following areas throughout the term:</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>PLACE VALUE:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Understanding hundreds, tens and ones. *Representing, counting, ordering and comparing numbers to 1,000. *Finding 1, 10, 100 more or less than a given number. 	<h3 style="margin: 0;">Creative</h3> <p>ART:</p> <p><i>Driving Question: How can we, as artists, capture the beauty of our local area?</i></p> <p>We will explore the work of local artist *Peter Dorey, with particular emphasis on their painting, Red Night. Using our observational and blending skills we will create our own sunset scenes of Poole Harbour using paint.</p> <p>MUSIC:</p> <p>To learn the song **Spread my Wings from the film Inside Out. To perform in a group and the use of body percussion to help with rhythm.</p> <p>SPANISH:</p> <p>In Year Three we will begin learning the 'Modern Foreign Language' Spanish. We will focus this term on speaking, listening and reading:</p> <p>Greetings, numbers to 10 and days of the week</p> <div style="text-align: right;">  </div> <p>*Duo Lingo is a great free app to begin learning Spanish.</p>
<h3 style="margin: 0;">Times tables</h3> <p>As well as being critical for everyday life, knowledge of multiplication tables helps children to solve problems quickly and flexibly, and allows them to tackle more complex mathematics later on in school.</p> <p>In school, we continue to teach and practise times tables at every opportunity. Each child has their own *IT Rockstars login, which they can use at home, and you can support your child further through quick-fire questioning or using a flashcard approach.</p>	<h3 style="margin: 0;">SMSC & British Values</h3> <p>Spiritual: Experiencing and respecting other beliefs. THE UNIFORM CONSISTS OF:

- A grey blazer, with island blue braiding and the Ocean Academy logo
- A black v neck jumper (plain or blue piping)
- A white long or short sleeved shirt (not polo shirt) and blue clip or full length tie must be worn
- Black trousers or skirt
- Black shoes (no trainers, open toes or high heels or black boots)
- In warmer weather children may wear grey or black formal shorts
- Blue and white gingham checked dress can be worn in the summer term only
- Blazers must be worn to and from school every day
- Only school approved badges should be worn on lapels of blazers
- Earrings should be one individual stud or a pair of small studs (should not be worn on PE days)
- Hair bands should be one colour, discreet and not be overly decorative.
- Hair colour should be one natural colour and hair styles should not be extreme or have lines / patterns cut into the hair
- No make – up
- Tights should be plain black or white
- Socks can be long or short and should be plain black or white

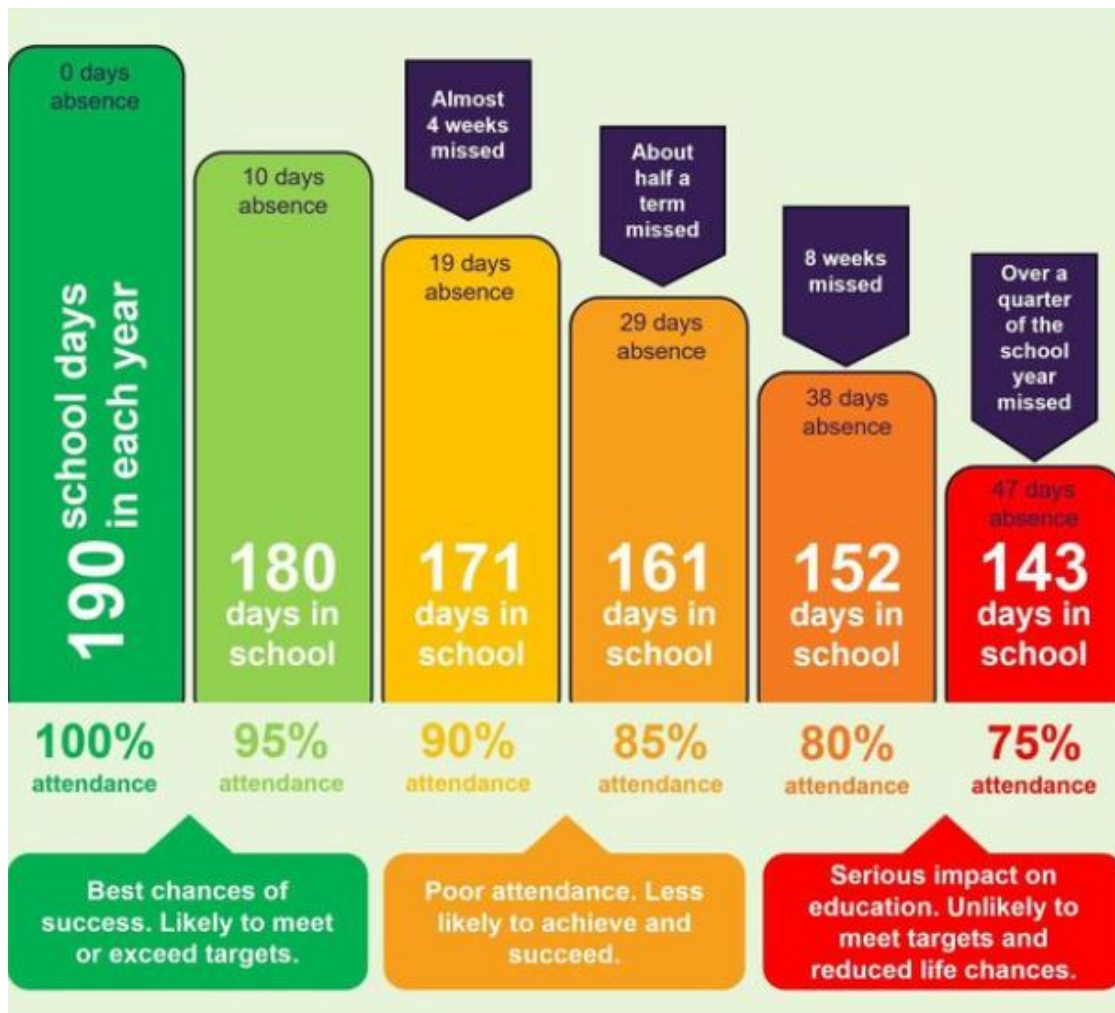
